indeed if there is to be any hope
for her in the future the sooner
this can be done the better as

conversation would have a very
bad effect on Bridget

Though we do not as a rule
like to take these girls before the
care is tried we will make an

exception of her on the condition we
will not be held responsible if she
escapes. I believe there is little to fear
on that score. Only mention it -

He will take her back if found
guilty.

as long as she desires to stay, on
condition her conduct would be such
as not to force us to dismiss her -
of course before doing so you or her
parents would be advised.
