HOSIERY INDUSTRY.

Under the Statistics (Census of Production) Orders (Statutory Rules and Orders, No. 46, 1926 and No. 63, 1927) made under the Statistics Act, 1926, returns were received relating to the operations in 1926 of the 33 principal establishments in Saorstát Éireann at which the making of Hosiery goods was carried on in that year. Figures relating to the production of the smaller establishments making Hosiery have not been included in the following tables - the total amount involved being small. The Returns received from these 33 establishments indicated that 23 were the usual type of business concerns, three of which employed Outworkers only, and that ten were in respect of Institutions (Convents, etc.) at which Hosiery goods were made for sale.

TIME IN OPERATION:

Excluding Institutions at which it would appear that no regular hours were worked and the three businesses which employed Outworkers only, the Returns received showed that 14 establishments were at work during the whole year, three worked 270-276 days and three others 230-270 days. The normal hours of work were for seven firms a 48-hour week, for eight firms a 44-hour week and the remaining five firms ranged from 38 hours to 42 hours per week.
