DUBLIN MAN'S BEQUESTS

Mr. Bernard Fitzsimons, of Riversdale, 134 Lower Drumcondra road, Dublin, who died on December 11th, 1937, aged 87 years, has left personal estate in England and Eire valued at £21,244.

He left £500 to the Association for the Propagation of the Faith, £250 for supplying copies of the *Catholic Standard* and the *Messenger* to the Jervis Street Hospital and the Mater Hospital; £200 each to the Catholic Truth Society of Ireland, Holy Cross College, Dublin; St. Joseph's Young Priests' Society, the Catholic Protection and Rescue Society, St. Columban's College, Slurle, for the China Mission; the African Mission for the district of Zanzibar, the Hospice for the Dying, Dublin; the Sacred Heart Home, Drumcondra, and Our Lady of Charity of Refuge and Magdalen Asylum, Dublin, and £200 to the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Dublin towards the building of a new church in Gloucester street, Dublin, and a further £200 towards the building of a new church in Upper Drumcondra.

Mr. Julian George Wandesford Butler, of Wynn's Hotel, Dublin, died on May 7th last, leaving personal property in England and Eire valued at £6,134.

Mrs. Alice Kenny, of John's Bridge, Kilkenny, died on January 10th last, leaving personal property in England and Eire valued at £5,223.

Mr. Richard Michael Dawson, of the Marine Hotel, Sutton, Dublin, died on March 4th last, leaving personal property in England and Eire valued at £2,225.

Miss Josephine Rafferty, of the Mercy Hospital, and formerly of 11 St. Patrick's Hill, Cork, who died on April 18th last, has left personal estate in England and Eire of the value of £3,649.
