CAVAN SOLICITOR'S WILL

WILL

Determining matters arising on a summons for the construction of the will of Frederick Edward Kennedy, solicitor, Cavan, Mr. Justice Gavan Duffy, in the High Court, Dublin, yesterday, directed, on agreement between the parties, that a bequest of £100 "for the Magdalen Asylum, Dublin," be divided between the Hagdalen Asylum, Lower Gloucester street; and, on consent of both parties, that a similar bequest "for the Cancer Hospital, Dublin," be divided between the Skin and Cancer Hospital, Hume street, and St Anne's Cancer Hospital, Hume street, and St Anne's Cancer Hospital, Northbrook road. He held that the bequest of £100 "to the Redemptorist Fathers, Drogheda," was intended to be for the Redemptorist Fathers, Dundalk. He directed that the legacy and estate duty was payable from the total legacy fund as ascertained, and that the net fund then was to be divided into 31 shares—there were \$1 legacies of £100 to persons and institutions in the will—one share to be paid to each legates whose legacy was effective, and lapsed shares to fall into the residue. He allowed the parties their costs out of the residue.
