- £200 to the Superioress of the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Assumption, Camden St., Dublin, for the local charitable work of the Sisters.

In addition, the testatrix devised and bequeathed the residue of her estate to the Superioress of St. Mary's Convent of Mercy, Ballyroan, Rathfarnham, aforesaid, towards the cost of erection of a chapel for the convent.

The testatrix appointed Maureen Fagan, of 29 Henley Park, Churchtown, Co. Dublin, married woman, and Edward Joseph O'Brien, 35 St. Stephen's Green, Dublin, solicitor, to be her executors and trustees to whom probate of said will was granted in the Principal Probate Registry on the 12th November, 1963.
