NOTICE OF CHARITABLE BEQUESTS
In the Estate of
ELIZABETH NEALON, Deceased.

1957

NOTICE is hereby given pursuant to the Statute 30 and 31 Victoria, cap. 54, that Elizabeth Nealon, late of St. Michael's Ladies' Guest House, Whitehall, Drumcondra, Dublin, widow, deceased, who died on the 26th day of September, 1955, by her Will dated the 19th day of August, 1954, and a Codicil thereto dated the 4th day of December, 1954, made the following charitable bequests:-

← £1000 - Drumcondra

(1) A sum of One thousand Pounds (£1,000) to the Superintendent of Saint Michael's Home, Drumcondra, for the benefit of said home.

(2) A sum of One hundred Pounds (£100) to Father Cosgrave, C.C., of Saint Michael's, Halston street, Dublin, for Masses for the repose of her soul and the soul of her late husband at the honorarium of £1 for each Mass.

(3) A sum of Seventy Pounds (£70) to Monsignor Glennon, of Archbishop House, for Masses for the repose of her soul and the soul of her late husband at an honorarium of £1 for each Mass.

(4) A sum of One thousand Pounds (£1,000) to the Superiors of High Park Convent, Drumcondra, Dublin, for the charitable objects of the said convent.

(5) A sum of Thirty Pounds (£30) to the Abbot of Ampthorpe Abbey, York, for the Gregorian Masses which the deceased desired to have offered for her soul immediately after her death.

(6) A sum of Three hundred Pounds (£300) for the Superiors of the Medical Missionaries of Mary, Drogheda, for the charitable objects of the said Missionaries.

(7) A sum of Two hundred Pounds (£200) to the Magdalen Asylum, Donnybrook, Dublin, for the charitable objects of the said Asylum.

(8) A sum of Two hundred Pounds (£200) to the Superior of Saint Paul's, Mount Argus, for the charitable objects of the said Institution.

(9) A sum of Three hundred Pounds (£300) to the Superiors of the Carmelite Convent, Mount Talbot avenue, Dublin, for the charitable objects of the said Convent.

(10) A sum of Two hundred Pounds (£200) to the Superiors of Our Lady's Hospices for the Dying, Harold's Cross, Dublin.

(11) A sum of Two hundred Pounds (£200) to the Royal Hospital for Incurables, Donnybrook, Dublin, for the charitable objects of the said Hospital.

(12) A sum of Five hundred Pounds (£500) to Father Doery, P.P., of Kilmacud, Dublin, for the new Church at Kilmacud.

(13) A sum of Three hundred Pounds (£300) to the Catholic Archbishop of Dublin for charitable objects at his discretion in the Archdiocese of Dublin.

(14) A sum of Two hundred Pounds (£200) to the Superior of Saint Mary's College (Boys' Hostel), Fethard, Kimmage, Dublin, to provide prizes for the Boys' school there.

(15) A sum of One hundred Pounds (£100) to Sister Gabriel of St. Vincent de Paul Convent, Marino, Dublin, for such charitable purposes as she sees fit.

(16) The Testatrix directed by her Will dated the 19th day of August, 1954, that one-third of the residue of the remainder of her property should be left to the Superiors of the Convent of Sisters of Charity, Cappagh, Dublin, for the charitable objects of the said Institution.

(17) By a Codicil to her Will dated the 4th day of December, 1954, the Testatrix revoked the legacy of One thousand Pounds bequeathed under her Will to the Superiors of High Park Convent, Drumcondra, and having directed that a sum of One thousand pounds be invested for the benefit of a minor and the income therefrom to be applied for his education. The Testatrix directed that should there be any unexpended balance of the capital or any income from this sum of One thousand Pounds such balance should be bequeathed to the Superiors of High Park Convent, Drumcondra, Dublin, for the charitable objects of the said Convent.

By her said Will dated the 19th day of August, 1954, and confirmed by the Codicil dated the 4th day of December, 1954, the Testatrix appointed the National Bank, Limited, of 13-17 Old Broad street, London the Sole Executor and Trustee and Probate of the said Will and Codicil was on the 13th day of April, 1956, granted to the said Bank forth of the Principal Probate Registry of the High Court of Justice in the Republic of Ireland.
